Graham conducted fun and at times a lively auction with some items attracting very keen bidding

























Alan Thompson showed a jig he made to use instead of Cole Jaws. The jig was made from plywood and is adjustable to suite different size bowls

If you are interested in this challenge, work out a price and **contact Neale Rees**, for her details. The pictured Urns, sell for \$450. A bit high for her.


GAVEL

Val had a family easy job this meeting as there weren't many items for show and tell. Show and tell was conducted in typical Val style.












Bruce Black showed 2 items, a square bowl in Blackwood and a live edge bowl turned "green" and allowed to dry naturally. Finished with danish oil.
